Again, as a Head Coach I am absolutely honoured to coach an athlete like Zac Dell

Zac Dell had an unreal start to his 2019 Swimming season as an 18 year old after being selected to represent New Zealand at the 2020 World University Games in Naples, Italy as well as represent them again at the 2020 FINA World Junior Championships in Budapest, Hungary, which saw Zac and Head Coach Mitch Nairn spend 2 Months in Europe racing and preparing between the events which were 3 weeks apart from each other. Zac qualified for the 50m/100m/200m Backstroke Events and both international competitions after several dominating performances at Zac's last NAGs in 2019, and a 1st ever Individual Medal at Opens 2019 in the 50m Backstroke gaining a Bronze next to his teammate and training partner Andrew Jeffcoat. World University Games was a massive eye-opening experience for Zac at what swimming against the best in the world looks like, and how world champions and professional athletes behave on pool deck to order to succeed at the top level of swimming consistently. Which he carried on working on in our Spain training camp to then perform well at World Juniors in Budapest in the 50m/100m Backstroke where he gained a 15th in the 100m Backstroke and 17th in the 50m Backstroke. Zac had gained all the confidence in the world after these two events, coming back to NZ and then racing at NZ Short Course just one month later were with Andrew, blew everyone away with his performances. Zac was the top point's scorer of the swimming meet and walked away with a total of 17 medals!! Age Group and Open (7x Gold, 7x Silvers, 3 Bronze Medals) and 2x NZ 18yr old NZ short course records in the 50m and 100m Backstroke (Both held by Daniel Bell) were he finished just behind teammate Andrew. It was an outstanding meet for Zac who alongside with Andrew both established themselves as ones to watch for the future. Zac then finished the 2019 Season competing at both the 2020 Queensland and Victorian State Championships which was his last 2x Swimming Meets as an Age Grouper! Were he picked up a Silver in the 100m Backstroke at Queensland

She finished the meet also with 7x Top 10 finishes. This was just the beginning for Kate, she then went on to Division 2 championships down in Dunedin where she then made her 1 st NAGs time in the 200m Butterfly and also placed 2 nd in a 2:36.18 (a 4.26sec PB – From NZ Junior Festival) as well as picked up a bronze in the 100m Butterfly at the same event in a 1:09.68 (a 1.08sec PB). Kate was lucky enough to just turn 13 years before NAGS 2019 and swam in both the 100m and 200 Butterfly in this event down in Wellington where she made her very 1 st 2x NAG finals as a new 13yr old and finished with both 2x PBs in the finals as well as a 5 th Place in the 200m Butterfly 2:38.50 LC (Nearly as fast as what she Swam it short course 1 month ago. Thomas Murray, best known for his nicknames TJ or Tommy is one of the most exciting young backstroke prospects in the country at the moment. Thomas is lucky enough to be working alongside 2 of the best Backstrokes NZ has ever had at his home club PSC. 2019 was a Massive year for TJ his progress rate (PBs) dropping dramatically from 2018 which has seen him classed as a Swimming NZ Gold Standard Swimmer in his Age Group (15yrs). NAGs 2019 was where it all started for TJ, winning the Triple Crown in all three of the Backstroke Events for his age group (50m/100m/200m) with his 200m backstroke being the most impressive swim of the lot which gave TJ the Gold Standard 15yr old time (2:11.53). TJ also nearly broke the 1:00 minute mark in the 100m Backstroke which is no easy feat for a 14yr old Backstroker, and only a few have done so at his age. TJ was then selected for his 1 st NZ Swimming Team, as was to be a Part of the 2019 NZ States Team travelling to Australia to compete against the best swimmers in each state across Australia. Unfortunately TJ was unable to participate in this event, but was able to compete for the PSC Team at NZSC 2019 where again he took out the Triple Crown in his 15yr old age group for the Backstroke Events (50m/100m/200m) and made a statement making 3x OPEN A Finals in all three backstroke events alongside his team mates Andrew Jeffcoat and Zac Dell. TJ also finished the meet with (100% PBs) for his Age Group events. But it didn't stop there, TJ too was also lucky enough to make the PSC 2020 Victorian State Age Group Team to travel to Melbourne to compete with some of the best Australian swimmers in the country where he came away with 2x Silver Medals in both the 100m and 200m Backstroke events. TJ has been a standout regionally and has excelled immensely in his age group and open age at all Counties Manukau swimming meets for both 2019/2020 and his lead in preparation would have seen him standout this year at NAGS 2020 if The event was to go ahead. Olivia had 7x Top 3 placings at the 2019 NZ Junior Festival with a 100% PB Rate with all her swims as a 10&a ;under. This year now competing in the 11yr old age group in 2020, she finished up with 11 Top 3 placings out of 12x races (6x 1 st places) and again a massive 100% PB rate at this meet making huge dents into her previous personal best times. She has also qualified for National Ager Groups as a 13yr old girl for some of her events on top of this mighty achievement. Such a hard year for coaches with the cancellation of NZ Opens, NAGS and Div II, however this coach took Pukekohe Swimming Club to a level they have never seen before. With 3 swimmers on the Olympic Long List (Andrew Jeffcoat, Zac Dell and Australian based Michael Pickett), Mitch's coaching skills and passion for his swimmers and the sport is continuing to attract swimmers from outside the region, to join PSC. Mitch's presence pool deck is noticed not only throughout the Counties region, but also nationwide and his selection as part of the SNZ Coaching Team for the World University Games in Italy signifies his coaching skills and expertise is recognized at the highest level. Mitch was also asked to continue on with the coaching team attending Fina World Junior Championships, however chose to return to New Zealand ensuring he was available for his athlete's in the lead up into NZ Short Course.

Mitch has an extremely strong presence on pool deck and his enthusiasm and dedication to his swimmers is outstanding. This has without a doubt reflected in the results his swimmers have worked hard to achieve over the past year.

Mitch took a team of 25 swimmers to NZ Short Course in October 2019, where PSC finished 2nd overall (in age group points), behind the much larger team from North Shore Swimming Club. This was the largest team PSC has ever taken to NZ Short Course and the highest ranking achieved.

January saw a team of 21 travel to Taupo to compete in NZ Open Water. Mitch took many of the team out of their comfort zones with this being a first for many swimmers, competing in Open Water. With no open water specialists, PSC improved their 2nd overall placing in 2019, by taking top honours and 1st club overall. Mitch has also been invited to attend SNZ camps, which indicates his skills and expertise is very much valued, at the highest of levels and regular visits from SNZ to the club, recognizes the value SNZ see in Mitch and the athlete's he coaches.

As a Head Coach I am absolutely honoured to coach an athlete like Andrew Jeffcoat. Andrew has just recently in the last year joined PSC and the Counties Manukau region and has already brought in so much to offer to both the club and the region. Andrew commitment, mannerism, determination, focus, and heart bring so much hope into this sport that is swimming, which helps inspire an entire club and its swimmers. After losing his long-term coach/mentor/ friend Ken Nixon at Fairfield Swimming Club at the start of 2019 Andrew has grown into a young man that is determined to change this sport in New Zealand and show everyone that it doesn't matter how tall you are, how good your swimming facilities are, if you work hard and believe you are capable of greatness, and behave everyday like an Olympic athlete you will one day reach your full potential in the water. Andrew is one of the most current fastest progressing athletes in the water to date according to Swimming New Zealand. His rate of progression this year has seen massive leaps and bounds, and he has established himself as an Olympic athlete of the future for Swimming NZ. Andrew finished this year off only 0.70sec off the Olympic Qualifying time for the 200m Backstroke. And as his coach I can tell you now if NZ Opens went ahead this year he would have qualified for that event, I am that confident. Andrew is a key figure at PSC, he is the club captain, and has taken to the role with ease Only wanting the best for the future athletes of this swimming team. He has run Backstroke Clinics to help his team and others, as well as stays latter after training with the younger athletes in the PSC senior squad to help them understand there strokes better, and start to learn how they can also start mastering there craft like he has done over the years he has spent in the water. Andrew results have stood out massively this season. It all started at Opens 2019 were Andrew claimed his first open national title in the 50m Backstroke in a new Counties Manukau recorded of 25.36 just off the current NZ record held by Daniel Bell 0f 25.25. He also took silver in the 200m Backstroke in 2:00.41 (2.0sec PB). But this was all just the beginning as NZ Short Course 2019 was up next where Andrew along with his training partner Zac Dell were the standout athletes of the swimming meet for 2019. This was made even more impressive by Andrew as he was without a coach (Me) and training partner (Zac Dell) for 2 months well both of them were away swimming and coaching for NZ overseas. Andrew manged to bring in 8x National Open Medals (4x Golds, 3x Silvers, 1x Bronze) and 100% PBs, most notable his 50m Backstroke in a time of 23.94 seconds which is a time under FINA A Standard, and only 0.15 off the Open 50m NZR again held by Daniel Bell and a new Counties Manukau recorded. Two months later Andrew was named on the Swimming New Zealand Pathway to Podium Team to travel to Brisbane for the 2020 Queensland State Championship were he medalled in the 100m/200m Backstroke (2x Silvers), and was a part of the Swimming NZ Relay Team that collected Silver in the 4x50m Medley Relay just out touched by Japan! The highlight though for Andrew was his 200m Backstroke. With only a few people in New Zealand to have every broken the 2:00 mark for 200 Backstroke Andrew finished in a time of 1:58.51! Which lift him 0.70 off the 2020 Olympic Qualifying Time heading into Olympic Trials. One last hit out was needed overseas before Trials were to happen a month out were Andrew headed to Melbourne to Race at the 2020 Open Victoria State Championships were, he picked up medals again in the 50m/100m/200m Backstroke. Unfortunately, with Trials and the Olympics postponed Andrew is now back in the pool and focused on NZSC 2020 in October in hope to break as many NZ records as possible and in the process also make the 2020 FINA World Short Course Team to Abu Dhabi and then the Olympic Games in 2021. Andrew Jeffcoat is a worthy recipient of this award and we are all excited to see what he can do for the 2020/2021 season.
